Additions to Program Notes: Summary----2006 AR: All 16 member cities have residential curbside recycling collection programs. All of the member cities include a commingled recycling program, but not all members have automated systems for collection.

Artesia- 608.41 TONS collected from the blue bin. The tonnage went down from 2005 because no numbers were tracked from CR&R Transfer Station located in Stanton; Artesia is also not tracking the amount taken to Recycle American, a subsidiary of Waste Management which was purchased from Quality Paper Fibers.

Beverly Hills- City provides two bins: one for green waste and one for mixed waste. Crown Disposal takes the mixed waste to the MRF. In 2006, Beverly Hills collected 28383 tons.

Duarte- 1450.93 Tons collected from residential curbside program.

Hermosa Beach- On going program. 1960.72 tons collected.

Hidden Hills- The program is ongoing, 480.32 Tons

Lynwood- 2816 tons were collected

Manhattan Beach- 7,460.49 tons of recyclable. All residents are participating in the curbside recycling program. City offers free 64 or 96 gallon containers to residents in the automated collection program. For residents in the manual collections program, 32gallon containers are provided free of charge. Extensive education and outreach events continue to be implemented through newsletters, events, and newspapers ads. The hauler agreement specifies 50% diversion of material is to bediverted and it is being met. In addition Earth-Day and Hometown Fair public events are well attended. Promotional items were handed out by Waste Management and LARA and included mini recycling bins, refrigerator magnets, and pencil holders. Recycling questions were asked of families and children before the promotional items were awarded. The positive result of this is two-fold: source reduction and reuse is emphasized through the questions and further reiterated by recycling totchkes. Promotional products included a holiday flyer that promotes recycling.

Palos Verdes Estates - Has a 3-bin auto, commingled system of 32-gallon containers collected weekly. 2,181 tons in 2006 was collected by Norcal as they have the exclusive franchise.

Pomona-8907.16 Tons collected.

Rancho Palos Verdes- Pilot automated program continued in 2006.

Redondo Beach- About 9,278 tons residential curbside recycling was collected in 2006.

Rosemead- 2893 Tons.

Sierra Madre- Residents have a choice between a 64 and a 96-gallon automated container which is collected by Athens Disposal Services. 2546.38 tons of residential curbside recyclables was collected in 2006 and does not include the June data. South Gate- The disposal went up from 2878 to 4838. The city has a curbside residential program for residents

There are several facilities and residents are allowed to use the drop off centers within the city.
