How It Works

- **Receives export of service data**
 - Data upload
 - Eventually via API data packet
- **Algorithms determine covered and recycling status**
- **Integrates outreach and compliance info**
- **Generates 'call to action' letters**
- **Stakeholders update common database**



Jurisdictions Should Control

- **Determinations and actions about:**
 - Self-haul
 - Third-party recyclers
 - Recoverable edible food
 - Exemptions
 - Enforcement



SB 1383 Regulations

‘Nothing in this chapter authorizes a jurisdiction to delegate its authority to impose civil penalties, or to maintain an action to impose civil penalties, to a private entity.’

Implementation Requirements on Jurisdictions

Title 14, Division 7, Chapter 12, Section 18981.2 (d)



Model Franchise Agreement

‘Jurisdiction reserves the right to require the Contractor to maintain the records required herein through the use of a Jurisdiction-selected web-based software platform, at Contractor’s expense.’
