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

Recycling is struggling

- Recycler closures
- Diversion rate plummeting (State rate is 37%)
- More complex, difficult materials to collect, sort & recycle
- Asian market decline and commodities volatility


Finite resources, infinite demands



- Time, Information and Access
- Build Strong Community Partnerships
- Create a Virtual Reuse Network
- Always Promote, Network and Ask for Leads
- Bricks and Mortar for maximum diversion (stay with me here...)

- Takes unusual, industrial items
- Bricks and Mortar
- On-line network
- Private business



Trash 4 Teaching: (Gardena)

- Scrap materials for art teachers and STEM programs
- Bricks and Mortar
- Large quantities of one item
- Non-profit (Two Bit Circus Foundation)







Reuse Models— Public Sector

- Materials for the Arts (NYC)
- Scrap art materials
- Art education and workshop components
- Offer pick up of donations
- Bricks and mortar: 38,000 sf building
- Established in 1978
- NYC Department of Cultural Affairs

WHY CAN'T THE PRIVATE SECTOR HANDLE THIS?

Answer: Instability

- While thrift store quality items are profitable, scrap materials are not.
- Selling means inventory doesn't churn quickly. Sitting on inventory means more square footage = costs.
- Overhead costs, such as high rent, cuts into the ability to make enough profit to sustain the enterprise.
- Renting is risky and finding a suitable and affordable site is difficult.
- Lack of feasibility keeps reuse a boutique business segment, but not a true diversion factor.



A CAUTIONARY REUSE TALE





"VIRTUAL" EFFORTS ARE NOT ENOUGH

While a strong online presence is vital, the greatest chance for success is having a physical facility.

Moreover, you can't rely on local thrift stores since much of what they receive through "donations" are actually disposed.

- AVOID REDUNDANCY: A municipal reuse program should target the more unsaleable, unloved, worn, broken, and misfit items that have no other place to go other than landfill.
- TONNAGE CREDIT: A facility allows for weights and other records to be managed.
- BRICKS AND MORTAR: Online will move an item, but a physical space will move a carload
- FREE GIVEAWAYS: Moves material quickly so you need less square feet



SANITATION DEPARTMENT BENEFITS:

- INCREASES DIVERSION and supplements recycling decline
- Eases illegal dumping
- Verifiable tonnage records
- Easier to site and meet regulations
- Justifies rate increase—valuable service
- Work in tandem with Bulky Service

RETURN ON INVESTMENT

INTRINISIC VALUE:

- Provides positive waste alternatives
- Public benefit to donate and receive materials
- Ease and awareness with a one-stop shop
- Culture change and new view of consumption
- Free materials helps lower income populations
- Encourages business in-kind donations
- Builds a large donation recipient base to expand reuse efforts
- Create opportunities for work training programs
- Storytelling and PR opportunities
